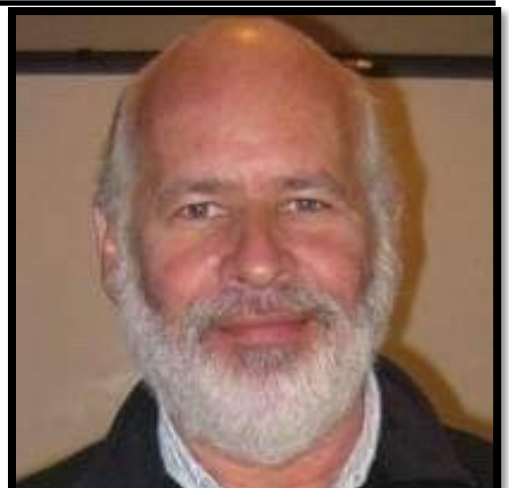
Lorelie Rozzano
