- Brandy Jules has been removed from office of Band Council effective October 23, 2016 for Breach of Oath of Office (four violations)



MEMO - ROBIN BILLY

It is with a heavy heart that I resign as Chief of the Adams Lake Indian Band. The reasons are many, but primarily for personal reasons. Currently, have been 3 Councilors removed and it is like a bomb has been dropped on our community. After long consultation with my family I have to do what is best for them. I have worked extremely hard for Adams Lake and my focus has always been **on the land** and taking care of our territory. However, our Council keeps getting sucked back into Administrative-type issues and it consumes so much of our energy and pits people against each other. I truly believe if we work collectively to take back our land, all of the constant infighting in the community would cease.

I apologize to the people that supported me, our elders, and youth but I believe the Indian Act system will continue to further divide us and I won't have friends, family, and community members turn against me over it. I care for and respect all of our people but have to take care of myself and family first. In the spring you will see the results of our Council's hard work: new potable water line, new subdivision in Switsmalph, Chief Atahm School expansion, health centre expansion, partnership development with Glen Echo, cabins built up the Adams Lake (in progress), talking back land up the Adams Lake,, and so much more. In 18 months we were able to accomplish a lot and as a community we cannot let this work die.

I will be moving out on the land with no service/internet for a while and focus on hunting and providing for my family. I have only taken 4 days off since taking office and no longer do any of the things I love. Once I start to feel better I will type detailed notes on all of the important files we have been working on. There is so much more to say but this role is not conducive to a person's health and well-being. It has become normalized to attack Chief and Council and is intensified now with social media. Prayers for everyone and every job I served my people and accomplished so much, I will continue this work but not under the Indian Act system....As a leader I am prepared to sacrifice my position, not only to heal the divide in our community but for the start of something better.... - Kukstsemc



It's been a busy several months and I'm excited in giving you a brief update/collection of all that I have been involved in and recent happenings within our communities.

This term as a council member I decided to spend more time in the community, take part in events, be visible, attend regular meetings and take part in meeting with membership.

In the first week of May attended a Lands department information session in Salmon Arm -this was to review the Trans-Canada Highway (TCH) 4Laning & its impact on IR7- the discussion of the impact and how 4laning can affect the crossing in Sxwetsmèllp. The presentation was a balance of conversational, confrontational and was supportive, attendance was minimal. The other highlight was discussions on the 4laning and repairs TCH is doing in preparation of 4laning through to the Alberta boarder. Keep your ears to the ground for continued information and meeting updates.

C&C has been working, preparing and seeking various levels of funding agencies to assist in drafting out a proposal and agreement that would partner with Managements, organizations or business on the ALIB lands. This process is to draft out and find out what is the best use for our current lands. Reminder that ALIB Lands completed three Land Use Plans (LUP) 2012-2014 that focused business options on various portions of the reserve. Contact Iva, Lands Manager or Rena G, Executive Lands Assistant for review of the LUP.

Sexqeltkemc te Secwewepec-STS, meetings are usually the last Thursday of every month, meetings have been at the Pierre's Point Log Building -this is a central area for all bands to travel to, general agenda items are Governance, Projects, Energy, Tourism & Developments, Special Projects, Legal, Business, negotiators report.

The STS (people of the Secwepemc Lakes Division) is a coalition of the ALIB, Neskonlith and Splatsin since 2009. In a recent ceremony held in April the Little Shuswap Lake and Shuswap bands were welcomed to STS. Being politically correct is hard to do here, LSLIB & Shuswap was always there just not at the table during negotiations for agreements with corporations, business.

STS's business purpose is to enhance business in the STS territory. By liaising with existing business, establish job/work contracts, partnerships, ensure Agreements between major corporations. STS's vision is to rebuild

the historic kinship ties, assert aboriginal title & rights throughout the STS territory. To achieve this goal is to be stewards of Tmicw, sewllkwe ell mesmescen. All with the support and notification to membership.

Sexqeltkemc Enterprise Inc. (SEI) and Sexqeltkemc Limited Partnership (SLP) is the business arm of Sexqeltkemc te Secwepemc (STS). Appointed Board member for ALIB is Diane Jules. Business makes recommendation to the STS political on matters that will enhance, create and or attract work, contracts and or business off reserve on the STS shared territory. The SEI's main office is adjacent the Skwlax Gas Station. Dorry W is the Executive Receptionist; Leona L is Account for STS &SEI, Shawn B, Executive. STS formed the business entity of SEI and SLP in 2010. SEI portfolio are: Environmental Services, Energy, construction, Cloud and fiber and training opportunities. For more Information, stop by the main office of STS/SEI. Speak with Shelley W, STS Political Coordinator or Shawn B.

ALIB T&R's meetings were held on the last Thursday of every month at the Adams Lake Recreation & Conference Centre (Chase), but has now changed to first Wednesday of every month. The special and awesome work before each session is the sharing of family tree's (genealogy). T&R will host a session November 17th at the Pierre's Point Log building (PPLB) and will be scheduling regular bi-monthly sessions. All T&R meetings are open. Agenda items are updates on projects i.e. MOTI/TCH, Hydro, Sun peaks, projects that are within the STS territory. T&R department has a pamphlet and can be viewed on the ALIB Web page.

The financial work facilitated by ALIB is review of the Financial Administration Law (FAL). On June 29th ALIB held a GBM to elect Members to sit on the FAL Committee and ALIB finance committee. Eight candidates expressed interest and meeting have been scheduled. For information contact the finance department newly hired Chief Financial Officer (CFO) George Bailey. John M (interim CFO) is also orientating and working with ALIB finance.

One contiguous item at the Secwepemc Nation level is the negotiations of an Agreement-In-Principal (AIP) with the Northern Secwepemc te Qelmucw (NSTQ) Secwepemc Nation Tribal Chiefs (SNTC) have coordinated a responds to the AIP and a map that depicts land parcels currently identified for inclusion in the NSTQ AIP. For information contact Chief Robin or Bonnie L at the SNTC office Kamloops.

ALIB C&C were presented with a list of Band Member concerns at a GBM held on March 29, 2016. Administration/departments and C&C coordinated a response to the list of concerns, for a copy contact Elaine J or Diane J for copy of the response. Also the motion put forward support for projects to move into implementation stage i.e. the Envisio program= departments long term planning. For information on the Enviso program contact Karen E, CCSP Coordinator.

A project that I bring to your attention is the Sxwetz-malph ell Sxwetsmèllp cemetery revitalization (Salmon Arm). This project has been a silent but unlimited, significant other. With support of the communities a small team formed: Councilor Louis Thomas, Mark and Patty Thomas, Diana Thomas and myself. This cemetery has been shared by the two communities for centuries and over the years many community members and other organizations have volunteered hours of cleaning, cut-

ting and identifying the area's of loved ones. Not to create any more conflict than there is, I totally believe- if you can't take care your ancestors how can we move on with our healing. The vision is to have the site mapped out with plots of family members located, recorded, hopefully complete with info of individual and a headstone. In spring of 2017 the plan is to have a ceremony celebrating the site, recognizing Veterans at the site and to call our Relations back. Other plans include a spiritual Center, Laws around funeral, burials, repatriation interment, private sites. Next meeting date has not been set, will keep you posted.

Last but the best, Kukstec-kuc to the Sxwetsmèllp community for the ceremony that 'Celebrated Our Grandparents' on October 16/16, totally amazing on how many grandchildren are out there. Congratulations. Pictures will be available, contact Howie S.



Sun Peaks Resort 2016/2017 Lift Ticket/Pass Program



Kamloops & Area First Nations

If you are an Adams Lake Indian Band Member, this program is as follows:

1. Authorized band members can purchase a Sun Peaks Season Pass for \$325 plus GST. These passes will be discounted regular season passes with an authorization form only.

OR

- 2. Authorized band members can receive up to 5 complimentary lift tickets over the 16/17 winter season. A designated person from the Band Office must book the individuals in advance through AnneMarie Dill or Alecia Stevens in Guest Services. Please see Crystal Kelly at Health Centre for Authorization Form. Upon arrival the individuals must check in at Guest Services to pick up their tickets or pass and complete their waiver. Guest Services will have a list of authorized individuals from AnneMarie and a sign-in sheet.
- 3. Rental Equipment will be available for these same groups on the following basis: Comp standard rentals for mid-week, non-holiday periods. The price differential between standard and high performance will be charged for an upgrade. For holidays and weekends (Friday to Sunday) rentals will be discounted by 50% off the rack rate for either standard or high performance.
- 4. Children's Groups for the Bands will be complimentary for lift, lesson and rental. Chaperone comps are on a 1:20 basis for secondary school groups, 1:10 for elementary school groups and include lift passes only. These groups must be booked in advance through the Sales and Marketing Coordinator (Pauline Domanski) and will be limited to mid-week and non-holiday periods unless specific permission is granted from Darcy Alexander.

To All Shuswap Nation Chief, Council and Nation Members:

Re: Elk population in the East Kootenays

At a meeting of concerned parties it was determined that the Elk population in the Findlay Creek and Skookumchuck area is in serious decline. The Elk herds will need a minimum two years of restricted hunting to bring the population back to a healthy number. Present at this meeting, there was representation from Ministry of Forests, The Columbia Kootenay Conservation Officer and Bob Jamieson, a representative involved in the elk count for the East Kootenays.

Shuswap Band Chief and Council ask that all First Nation hunters follow the regular Elk hunting season for a minimum of two years. It is important that all concerned, native and non-native, abide by these regulations designed to preserve the Elk populations for future generations.

We are requesting the Shuswap Communities, by consensus, agree to the rules in place for the 2015 hunting season. Specifically in the Skookumchuck and Findlay Creek hunting areas. The rules are as follows:

1. Permit Only Hunting for all First Nations members wishing to hunt in the East Kootenays, will be \$ 30.00 (thirty) dollars. For 1 Elk, or 1 moose, and a deer, either Whitetail or Mule deer. These permits will be issued by the Shuswap Band Titles And Rights Department.

Please contact Rosalita Pascal at (250) 341-3678 Monday – Friday, or submit written requests to RR#2 3A- 492 Arrow road, Invermere B.C. V0A-1K2. Electronic submissions can be made by request to rpascal@shuswapband.net

- 2. All hunters will be required to report to the Shuswap Band of their intentions to hunt.
- 3. All hunters not permitted; will have their animals removed and given to the local First Nations for supporting community membership.
- 4. All proper documentation must be provided to local Conservation Officers at their request.
- 5. A notice of our guidelines along with the statement that: if we do not regulate hunting; there will be no Elk left to hunt. This will be sent out to all Bands.
- 6. All Elk taken from the East Kootenays must be reported to the Shuswap Band.
- 7. There will be no hunting after December 1 for the 2015/2016 hunting seasons.

The Shuswap Nation and Ktunaxa Nation are working together and in cooperation with the Province of BC to maintain the Herds.

It is important that we all understand the urgency and immediately implement a strategy to save the Elk populations in this region. This is a problem that we all share and we need to work together on a plan to fix it. We seek your support in developing a mutually agreed upon course of action so that we may stand united in our negotiations, with the Province of British Columbia and/or other levels of government on this matter.



Frequently Asked Questions

Election Rules - Community Panel

- Q. What is the history of the Community Panel and how did it come into existence?
- A. The Community Panel was in existence as far back as 1999 when the election rules were approved by Band membership
- Q. What is the role of the community panel?
- A. The Community Panel shall consist of five (5) elected members of which a quorum is mandated to make decisions on all appeals and petitions held to dispute an Election or any petition(s) to remove a Band Council member(s) from the office of Band Council; held in accordance with the ALIB Election Rules.
- Q. When can a Council member be removed from Office?
- A. Band Council member/s may be removed from office on one or more of the following grounds:
 - a) he/she has violated the ALIB Election Rules; or
 - b) he/she has breached their Oath of Office.
- Q. How does the Community Panel remove a Council member from office?
- A. The community panel as per its terms of reference must make a decision on whether there are facts to substantiate the removal of a council member due to a breach of their oath of office.
- Q. How do we make changes to the Community Panel?
- A. As per Part 28 of the Adams Lake Indian Band Election rules,
 - a) the Electoral Officer recommendations for change of the ALIB Election Rules, submitted to the Band Manager; or
 - b) a petition signed by not less than ten (10) ALIB Members requesting an amendment to the ALIB Election Rules submitted to the Band Council; and
 - c) a majority of the Electors present at a General Band Meeting who voted the ALIB Election Rules be amended.
- Q. Can a Council member appeal the decision of Community Panel as per their Oath of Office?
- A. As per the Council's members Oath of office Item 7 the Council member declares to abide by: "I will comply with the Community Panel's decision for removal from office."
- Q. Is the decision of Community Panel subject to a judicial review?
- A. All decisions of a Community Panel made under these Rules shall be final and binding and not subject to appeal or judicial review in any court provided, however, that an application for judicial review by an appellant or petitioner, as the case may be, or an Elector, shall lie to the Federal Court of Canada upon the grounds that the members of the Community Panel:
 - a) failed to observe a principle of natural justice or otherwise acted beyond their jurisdiction;
 - b) erred in law in making their decision, whether or not the error appears on the face of the record; or,
 - c) based their decision on an erroneous finding of fact made in a perverse or capricious manner or without regard for the material before them.
 - 23.18 An application for judicial review under Section 85.1 (2) of the Indian Act shall be made within 30 days of a decision being rendered by a Community Panel.
- Q. What are the next steps after a Removal and to fill the vacant seats?
- A. As per Part 27 in the Secwepemc Election Rules a by-election shall be held within sixty (60) days on a date set by the Electoral Officer.

1 teaspoon garlic powder

1 teaspoon ground cumin

Chicken Noodle Soup

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees Place chicken tenders in a large baking dish lined with parchment paper. Drizzle with 2 table-spoons of oil and sprinkle with spices. Place in the oven and bake for 25 minutes, flipping the chicken at the half way point. Once cooked, pull into small chunks using two forks.
- 2. While the chicken is roasting, prepare the soup.
- 3. Heat olive oil in a large, heavy bottomed soup pan over a medium flame. Add carrots, celery, and onion, and cook stirring occasionally for 8-9 minutes. Add garlic and salt and cook for another minute before adding the bay leaf, water and chicken stock. Increase heat to high, bring soup to a boil, then reduce heat to medium-low, stir in noodles, and simmer for 10 15 minutes, or until the vegetables are soft and the pasta al dente. Stir in cooked chicken, dill, and lemon juice. Taste soup to adjust seasonings, then serve at once.
