ABOUT THE WINTER SEASONAL GATHERING

We come together once again to embrace the ways of our ancestors and celebrate the seasons of change. Pelltetédem (crossing over month) we are told is a scared time of storytelling, knowledge sharing, and celebrating our connections with each other and the land.

The Seasonal Gathering initiative emerged as a recommendation from the 2016 governance engagement efforts. This will be the third gathering we have held this year; the first was at Pípsell (Jacko Lake) and the second in Sts'gil'xtn (Revelstoke). These gatherings provide opportunities to share our knowledge with each other and engage in important discussion about the management of our territory and sovereignty of our Nation.

Tk'emlúps translated into English means "where the rivers meet" and has been a meeting place for the Secwepemc people for centuries. We hope you enjoy your time here in Tk'emlúps and raise our hands to thank the community for hosting the Secwépemc Winter Gathering 2017.

Our Secwépemc Ancestors told us the importance of remaining true to our ways of being, and the risk of imitating other's ways in the *stseptékwll* (oral tellings) of *Sk'lep* (Coyote) and his hosts. In this telling, the Ancestors warn of the consequences of copying others through Coyote's experiences with *Skia'uzkelesti'mt* (Fat-man), *Stiauzka'instimt* (Fish-Oil man), and *Skala'uztimt* (Beaver man). In each instance, *Sk'lep* places himself in jeopardy and is harmed when imitating others. In his final attempt to steal the ways of *Tsalasti'mt* (Kingfisher man) *Sk'lep* plunges to his death and is luckily revived by Kingfisher. These are the lessons from the Secwépemc Ancestors warning us of copying or imitating other's ways.

The Secwépemc Winter Gathering, *Pelltetéq'em* (Crossing over month), is the first four-day gathering which will be held throughout Secwépemcúlecw. These Secwépemc gatherings will be held during the changing seasons in the four directions of the Secwépemc Nation. We do this to honour, recognize and respect the importance of our Secwépemc ways of being.

We have a deep and extensive connection to Secwépemcúlecw. The connection is embedded and celebrated in our language, oral histories, culture and laws. *Tsq'ey' ri7 mell ell, tsq'ey' ne mítkye-kt te m-sq'7est.s* (It is written and it has always been there in our blood). Our ancestral Secwépemc homefires (communities) survived the dark history of colonization and intentional cultural genocide. We honour and recognize the cultural knowledge kept collectively by the Kwséltkten (families) of our ancestral homefires. It is from the deep beds of coals of our Secwépemc ancestral homefires upon which a blazing fire of Secwépemc National unity will be built.

Honouring and standing up our Kwséltkten is integral to the health and governance of our Secwépemc Nation. *Xyemstém xwexwéyt re k'wséltkten-kt ell xwexwéyt re k'wseltktnéws-kt tek stet'e7ék te skwelk'welt wel m-t'7ek te cseksek'éwt ne sxuxwiyúlecwems nSecwépemcúl'ecw* (Respecting all our families from the highest peaks and valleys within our ancestral and traditional territories). The seasonal gatherings have been created to build a culturally respectful and safe space to share the priceless knowledge held in families. We know that through the sharing of knowledge we will ensure that, "All our Secwépemc relatives will take care of the land in perpetuity and pass it on to future generations." *Xwexwéyt re k'wseltktnéws te Secwépemc me7 tsyecwemínst.s re tmicw wel me7 yews, Tsyecwemíct.s k stet'e7ék te se7wít tek Secwépemc.*

We welcome *xwexwéyt re kw'séltkten* (All My Relations) in recognition of *Pelltetéqem* (crossing over month) as we gather to share our stories and knowledge before entering our homes for winter.
