Qwelmínte Secwépemc successfully wrapped up a 2nd year of summer interns. We developed a one of a kind internship program for Indigenous students at the university level. The interns selected become active players for transformation in land and resource management in a manner upholding Secwépemc law, jurisdiction and governance.

Our 2020 interns captured Indigenous & Western knowledge through a speaker's series for curriculum development; modelled wellbeing with sxúsem as well as effect of climate change on moose habitat in the North Thompson Watershed; and created our website.
