 Grief and loss counselling; Crisis counselling; Trauma counselling and crisis support; Clinical therapy; Art therapy; Alternative healing therapy; Energy healing; Family and group counselling; Basic life skills coaching and Traditional healing methods and medicines.

IRSSS staff are available for anyone experiencing pain or distress as a result of his or her Residential school experience with access to counselling, cultural and emotional support services.
