In 1902, eight-year-old Duncan Sticks from Esk'etemc, ran away from Mission and never made it home, he froze to death. We will release his spirit. There was an inquest into the children's being beaten and starved.

Esk'etemc are a strong, powerful, resilient peoples. Our ancestors predicted our future with the Qelmucw (the people) and prepared us for this time! They walked for Fasting, we will walk. Our ancestors brought us the healing spirit of the horses; we will ride.



Our ancestors worked with Elder Floyd Dick and brought us our Sekani7 cane and song so that our children will stand with the rest of the world, we will walk with our canes and sing for our children



Our Elder Fred Johnson brought us the commitment sticks and former Chief Charlene Belleau committed to stand with dignity before our Elders and children that we will not let another generation of our women and children fall victim to a cycle of violence and abuse.
